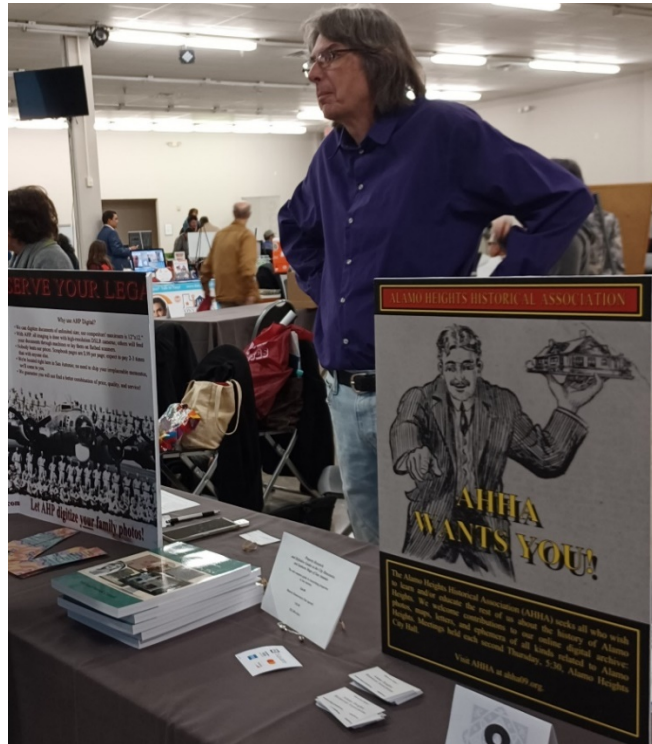
## PLEASE JOIN US !
